Future Water for North Texas

Learn about the benefits and the "how's" of water recycling. Carol Spruiell of the Texas Conservation Alliance will discuss new ideas in providing the water to support North Texas growth without building costly reservoirs. Recycling has become a significant factor for products that use up many of our natural resources, so what about water?

Company and from Sprint Nextel. She is a graduate of the University of Arkansas, and holds a Masters in Liberal Studies and a Masters in Business Administration from SMU. Her interest in water comes naturally, having been raised hunting and fishing in North and East Texas. She is a third generation North Texan.

Grand Canyon Adventure

Last April, five Sierrans set off on an 18 day trip down the Colorado River through Grand Canyon. They put in at Lee's Ferry and took out in the headwaters of Lake Mead at Pierce Ferry. For 18 days they enjoyed some of the grandest scenery and some of the biggest white water in the Lower 48 states. They took thousands of pictures and while none of them really do justice to what was seen, they would like to share some of them with you.

18 days seems to most people like a long trip. but if you've never done a trip like this you would be amazed at how fast it goes by. It seems like you've just started and suddenly



you're setting up your tent for the last night. It's possible to do shorter trips through Grand Canyon, but one of the guides (Regan Dale, with 43 years running the Colorado River) commented that doing that would be like buying a really good book and reading only the first three chapters.

They also saw some signs of what could have been. In two different places they saw the beginnings of dams in the Grand Canyon that would have turned much of it in to what John Muir called a water tank. The Sierra Club lost its tax exemption fighting these dams. The crystal clear water they floated on told another story: the silt and sand which once rendered the Colorado a deep red is now trapped behind Glen Canyon Dam just upstream of Lee's Ferry.

As with any long trip there are lots of stories and lots of scenery to share. Come to the July General Meeting and let the adventurers share some of the stories and pictures with you.

Everyone is welcome. You don't have to be a Sierra Club member. Just show up. We'd love to meet you.
