Our August General Meeting topics are Inner City Highways and Controlling Pests with Birds.

Inner City Highway Tear-outs

Cities around the country and the world are systematically removing highway infrastructure from their urban core, and they're doing so to improve local economy and livability. This discussion will create a distinction between types of highway infrastructure, the helpful and necessary from the wasteful and destructive, and illustrate how behavior patterns like transportation and real estate markets are a by-product of infrastructure policy and design. Ultimately, it will explore the possibility of highway

removal in Dallas and its effect on transportation patterns and economic development for Dallas.



Patrick Kennedy is an urban planner who has lived in Dallas for the past 11 years. He is a founding partner of Space Between Design Studio, an occasional columnist for D Magazine on issues of urbanism, is President of the North Texas Chapter for the Congress of New Urbanism, the Founder and creator of ANewDallas.com, and is on the board of Friends of Fair Park. Studies Show Harmful Effects of Fracking

Two new studies show harmful effects of fracking.

- UT Arlington has found high levels of arsenic and other contaminants in private water wells near gas operations. http://dfw.cbslocal.com/2013/08/05/uta-study-finds-contaminants-in-ground-water-near-gas-wells/
- National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) and the University of Colorado report alarmingly high level of methane emissions in Utah 6.2 to 11.7 percent of total production for an area about 1,000 square miles.

 This is greatly concerning because methane is 72 times worse than CO2 in contributing to global warming.
