Chris Guldi will share the results of leasing a solar power system on her house. And Plano Solar Advocates (www.planosolar.org) will tell us about their Solarize Plano Project, a pilot program that aims to demystify the process for homeowners of getting a PV system installed on their roof. After

holding information sessions this summer and signing up Plano homeowners ready to install solar, the group selected a qualified installer, negotiated a group deal, and are moving into the installation phase for participants.
