Well Water Contamination by Gas Drilling

Steve and Shyla Lipsky thought they had discovered their perfect Eden when they built their dream home on a beautiful bay in Parker County. They even had plenty of clean water from their well bored

into the Trinity Aquifer. Wells in the area had been successfully producing clean water for up to 15 years. In late 2010 Range Resources tested at least 29 wells and claimed they were clean. But shortly after Range Resources drilled the Butler gas wellhead, area residents began having serious problems with their wells.
