Northeast Texas Trail

Learn about the Northeast Texas Trail (NETT), a rural and urban trail traveling through 7 counties and 19 towns. This Rails to Trails Conversion along two unused railroad right-of-way, running from Farmersville, Texas, to New Boston, Texas, one day will be the longest trail in the state at 132 miles. The NETT is for specific use as a non-motorized trail allowing Hiking, Biking, and Equestrian recreation.

This past November, Tracy Rumsey set out to hike the NETT to

document current conditions and raise awareness of the project in hopes of promoting trail use and economic growth for the towns that this trail goes through. While several sections of the trail still need to be cleared in order to become fully open, the NETT provides a great experience for those wanting to find a place to hike close to home.

Maine Woods Photography

Scot Miller will discuss his seven-year effort photographing northern Maine for the new book, *Thoreau, The Maine Woods: A Photographic Journey Through an American Wilderness*, which combines contemporary imagery with text from Henry David Thoreau's classic collection of essays, *The Maine Woods* (first published 150 years ago). Miller will also screen *The Unexpected Journey*, a new short documentary about the making of the book. Book signing by the author will follow his presentation.

A highly regarded photographer, Scot Miller's work has formed the basis of numerous books, including *Walden: 150th Anniversary Illustrated Edition of the American Classic; Cape Cod: Illustrated Edition of the American Classic; First Light: Five Photographers Explore Yosemite's Wilderness;* and *My First Summer in the Sierra: 100th Anniversary Illustrated Edition*, winner of a 2011 National Outdoor Book Award. He is a contributor to the "Moment of Nature" videos, broadcast nationally on the Emmy Award-winning CBS Sunday Morning.



Sacramento Mountains, Cloudcroft, New Mexico Bus Trip - May 23-27

We're now accepting registrations for the Memorial Day weekend sleeper bus trip to this new destination ten miles east of Alamogordo. Our trails are in Lincoln National Forest at elevations from 7,800 to 9,500 feet, forested with fir, pine and aspen. We've reserved a group shelter for breakfast on arrival. One trip option is day hikes from this appealing base camp with vault toilets and a fire pit amphitheater. All other trips will continue after breakfast to trailheads along the Rim Trail. Thirty-one miles in all, the Rim Trail generally follows the divide between the Rio Grande and Pecos watersheds, with occasional views to White Sands and the Tularosa Valley far below. The Rim Trail was the first National Recreational Trail in New Mexico. Area history is tied to logging and the "Cloud-Climbing Railroad" that hauled out timber and brought in vacationers. Railroad grade and trestle remnants are prominent features on the day hikes.
