John Muir Live On Stage - Sunday, October 19

In *The Spirit of John Muir*, renowned actor Lee Stetson will showcase Muir's dedication to wilderness protection and search for adventure in Yosemite National Park and other wild places. Stetson portrays Muir every summer for thousands of people in Yosemite National Park's Theater, and he will be in Dallas for one night only.

Some of Muir's grand, thrilling adventures are in this show: "The Perilous Night on Mount Shasta" with Muir freezing in the midst of a howling blizzard while simultaneously being boiled and blistered in hot springs; his astonishing ride down a Yosemite Valley canyon wall on a snow avalanche; climbing the 500 foot wall of the winter ice cone beneath Yosemite Falls; Muir's encounter with a mighty Yosemite earthquake; dangerous Alaskan ice crevasses; snow blindness; and much more -- all liberally salted with Muir's wilderness philosophy. This show's theme revolves around the health and invigoration one acquires when one fully and joyfully engages wildness.

Explore Big Bend National Park on Our Annual Bus Trip

Read a full description of the Dallas Sierra Club's upcoming trip to backpack and hike in Big Bend National Park when you click here. We'll depart Dallas on a sleeper bus with professional drivers at 7:30 PM on Wednesday, Nov. 5 and return you to Dallas by 6 AM Monday, Nov. 10. The cost per



person (transportation and permits) is \$240 with timely registration.

This year's trip features five hikes. Destinations include the remote Mesa de Anguila, the varied landscapes of the Outer Mountain Loop and Mule Ears Overlook and two trips in the high Chisos Mountains, including either Blue Creek Canyon or The Window and Oak Spring. Our easy backpacking and camping option goes to The Chimneys formation, several desert springs, historic ruins and pour-offs.

Black bears have returned to the park since they disappeared in the twentieth century. The Park Service has announced a bear canister requirement as a condition for backcountry permits, but—good news-- the new rule will NOT be enforced in 2014. Come to the park THIS YEAR, before you need an expensive bear canister to explore the backcountry.

Trip registration forms are at the end of the linked trip description. We appreciate early registrations (which get you preferred seats and bunks), before the October date when we need to make full

payment for the bus charter. If you have questions after you've read the description, call Mark Stein or any of the trip leaders or email Mark.

Hike 10K (6 miles) on the Lake Ray Roberts Greenbelt Corridor. This is an easy trail running alongside the Elm Fork of the Trinity River. No reservations required, just show up. Well behaved pets on a leash are allowed. Bring water and a snack as we will be hiking all morning. Meet at 9:00 AM at the Highway 380 Trailhead Park. Admission to the park is \$5.00 per person or free with a Texas State Parks Pass. There will be an optional lunch afterwards. The Park is on US Hwy 380 2.1 miles west of Hwy 377 or 2.8 miles east of Loop 288 in Denton. Highway 380 can be reached from Central Expwy,Preston Rd., or the Tollway. Oct 24-26 (Fri-Sun) Eagle Rock Loop Backpack

Join me on a three day backpack on the longest loop trail (27 miles) in Arkansas. A combination of parts of the Little Missouri Trail, the Athens-Big Fork Trail and the Viles Branch Trail, the Eagle Rock Loop Trail crosses the Little Missouri River several times and travels over six major ridges. The hike will combine steep hill climbs through mixed hardwood and pine forests with strolls along crystal clear streams. It is arguably one of the best hikes in the Ouachita Mountains. Points of interest include Little Missouri Falls, Spirit Rock Vista, Eagle Rock Vista and Winding Stairs. Participants should have some backpacking experience. TRIP RATING: STRENUOUS (due to elevation changes along the Athens-Big Fork Trail and the amount of miles covered). Please contact the trip leader to sign up. Oct 25 (Sat) Day Hike Around White Rock Lake

Let's meet at the Stone Tables at White Rock Lake near Lake Highlands Drive and Buckner Blvd. From the intersection of Lake Highlands and Buckner, turn southwest on E. Lake Highlands. Take an immediate left (south) on Tiffany Way, then an immediate right on E. Lawther. There is a sign here but it now says "one Tables." The hike will start at 9:00am. Oct 25-26 (Sat-Sun) Car Camping in the Winding Stair Area in Oklahoma

We'll try to catch the fall colors in this beautiful part of the Ouachita Mountains this weekend. On Saturday, we will hike about 9 to 10 miles on a loop trail in the Horse Thief Springs area. The hike will be downhill into the Holson Valley in the morning, and uphill back to the cars in the afternoon. The day hike includes about 1900 feet of elevation change. There will also be a short day hike on Sunday morning before heading home. Because of the length and terrain of the day hike, this trip is rated as moderately strenuous.
