Texas Wildscapes

As human development continues to grow in Texas, habitat for our native wildlife becomes less abundant. To offset this impact, create a Texas Wildscape on your property to provide vital habitat to our local wildlife. This presentation will detail the components of a Wildscape and provide advice on how to create and maintain your Wildscape using native vegetation.

Derek Broman is an Urban Wildlife Biologist in the DFW Metroplex and an advisor for the Cross Timbers Master Naturalist Chapter. Has been with Texas Parks and Wildlife Department since January 2013 and is originally from rural Iowa. He has worked with numerous wildlife species throughout the Midwest, but was in New



England for 3 years before coming to Texas. While there, he studied bobcats for his Master's Degree in Wildlife Ecology from the University of New Hampshire and then studied black bears with the State of Connecticut. He offices out of Cedar Hill State Park, but works throughout the DFW Metroplex.

Clean air fans: You're needed on this day trip to support a sulfur dioxide emission standard proposed by the EPA to reduce haze at the places we love in Texas and neighboring states--Big Bend National Park, Guadalupe Mountains National Park, Wichita Mountains National Wildlife Refuge, Caney Creek Wilderness Area, Buffalo National River, and right here at home. There is NO CHARGE to participants. The bus is FREE, there's a FREE box lunch and a FREE dinner, all paid by the Sierra Club. An EPA public hearing on the haze rule starts at 5 PM, after a rally to support the proposed rule at 4 PM. The EPA proposes to override the weak rule proposed by Texas that the TCEQ says would achieve "reasonable, natural air clarity" at Big Bend by 2155. Is that good enough? A good turnout of support for better air quality matters. A tougher haze reduction program will benefit quality of life in Texas urban areas, too, and will likely hasten closures of the dirtiest coal-burning electricity generation plants in Texas. The bus departs from the Walmart parking lot at the northwest corner of LBJ Expressway and Midway Road, immediately behind the La-Z-Boy store at 10:30 AM Thursday, January 15 and will return by 11 PM the same day.
