Trinity Park Conservancy is dedicated to the stewardship of Dallas' largest public green space, the 10,000 acres of the Trinity River. Believing that the Trinity is the natural gathering place for all Dallas residents, the Conservancy is committed to bringing people together to share their ideas, learn more about the possibilities and habitat of the area, and to assist in making it a more accessible space.

Conservancy, will provide a comprehensive overview of the vision for the Harold Simmons Park and the Trinity River area. He will discuss the community engagement process, the findings from ten citywide workshops, and the First Look event on December 6th.

Brent is the 2017 GreenSourceDFW Lifetime Achievement Award winner in recognition of his sustainability efforts, and is a 2013 Rudy Bruner Award Silver Medalist, recognizing innovative thinking about the built environment and advancing conversation about making cities better. He also serves as Chairman of the Board for buildingcommunity WORKSHOP, an organization he founded in 2005 to solve difficult problems and enhance livability for all citizens.

NOTE: Trinity Park Conservancy created a **survey** that will provide a better understanding of how Harold Simmons Park can enrich our lives and be an inclusive space. It helps supplement the efforts of our 10 city wide workshops and learn the recreational and environmental appeal of natural spaces
