Mar 16-17 (Sat-Sun) Beginner Backpack Trip In Palo Pinto Mountains State Park

Palo Pinto Mountains State Park is about 70 miles west of Fort Worth in a hilly Cross Timbers area known as the Palo Pinto Mountains. The 4,000 acre park was acquired by Texas Parks and Wildlife in 2011 and it is expected to become one of the most popular parks in Texas. But the Texas Legislature has never funded development and the park is not yet open to the public. This has left the former ranch land about as close to wilderness as you'll find 2 hours from Dallas! The Dallas Sierra Club has special permission
