Jul 21-26 (Sun-Fri) Backpack in Colorado

This year's July destination for mountain backpacking is the Uncompany Wilderness, southwest of Gunnison. The area's been called the "Switzerland of America." We'll hike a loop using trails by the East Fork and Middle Fork of the Cimarron River. One party will hike 18 miles in four days, including a 12,600' saddle separating the two drainage basins. Two other parties will hike the same

trails plus a day hike to 14,301' Uncompander Peak, 29 miles in five days. This outing is strenuous due to the high altitude. Participants should have a previous multi-day backpacking experience. 
