Please join us as we welcome Urban Ecological Engineering Professor, Dr. Fouad Jaber, from Texas A&M AgriLife Dallas as he discusses **Green Infrastructure: Ecological Engineering and Urban Waters.**



Cities face a slew of environmental and ecological problems as urban populations spike across the globe. Addressing water quantity and quality issues the "usual way" has resulted in severe impairment of water bodies and other ecological disturbances: increased waste, increased need for energy, increased need for land for food, increased CO2 production, disruption to wildlife corridors.

Dr Jaber's focus is on assessing the quality and efficiency of green infrastructure for stormwater management, urban water conservation, natural stream restoration, rainwater harvesting, and alternative water sources such as graywater, and A/C condensate.

From 6:45 to 7:00 p.m. you can log in to the meeting, chat, and ask questions. The meeting will begin at 7:00 with announcements, followed by our speaker's presentation.
