In 2022, the Georgia Public Service Commission (PSC) requires Georgia Power to submit a proposal called an Integrated Resource Plan (IRP for short) for approval. The IRP lays out a roadmap for energy generation for the next 20 years and is a great opportunity to advocate for clean energy!

Entrees

Important actions to help Georgia win clean energy in 2022!

Witness, comment, or testify at Public Service Commission hearings.

- Make public comments in support of transitioning to clean, affordable energy.
- Provide expert testimony for clean energy intervenors.

Lobby the Public Service Commission (PSC) and Georgia Power.

- Send a letter calling for progress on climate and clean energy.
- Request clean energy and community solar programs from your energy providers and the Georgia PSC.
- Meet with <u>Georgia PSC Commissioners</u> and Georgia Power leadership.

Appetizers

Short, simple, and easy ways to get involved.

Activate and mobilize your members, supporters, and staff to take action.

- Send an email to your list.
- Share events and **petitions** on social media.
- Cosponsor educational town halls, promote rallies, or join a press conference.

Desserts

More time-intensive, but the most impactful way to get involved.

Become an intervenor during Georgia's energy planning processes.

- Take a front row seat by becoming a third party intervenor in the 2022 Integrated Resource Plan and Rate Case.
- Intervenors are granted formal legal status by the PSC to submit evidence, call for expert testimony, and cross-examine Georgia Power or other experts.
- Join our collaborative space for intervenors to discuss priorities on climate and clean energy in Georgia.
