## Arizona Climate and Conservation Groups Celebrate House Passage of Build Back Better Act

**(Phoenix, Arizona)** – On Friday, the U.S. House of Representatives passed the historic Build Back Better Act, which includes the most significant investments ever to address climate change. Following are statements from several Arizona climate and conservation groups on the House vote.

"The Build Back Better Act includes more than 100 programs that will invest more than \$500 billion in climate action, clean energy jobs, and environmental justice and will benefit communities across the country, including here in Arizona," said **Sandy Bahr, director for Sierra Club's Grand Canyon (Arizona) Chapter**. "We appreciate the support of Representatives Grijalva, Gallego, Kirkpatrick, Stanton, and O'Halleran for this historic legislation and urge our two senators to support timely passage in the Senate."

"In this season of Thanksgiving, we say 'Thanks' to our Representatives who voted to support the Build Back Better Budget," said **Rev. Doug Bland, Arizona interfaith Power & Light**. "Spiritual leaders from many faith traditions have called us to 'hear the cry of the Earth and the cry of the poor.' The social and environmental focus of the Build Back Better Act is one important answer to that call for justice and compassion."
