

Sierra Club Grand Canyon Chapter Primary Voter Guide 2022

Hello Sierra Club friends,

It is that time again — election time! In Arizona, we have seen unprecedented attacks on our democracy and voting and little to no action on the climate crisis. That is why it is more important than ever that we work hard to elect candidates who will put people over politics, human rights over corporate rights, and the health and welfare of our communities ahead of private profits.

This year, we were one vote shy of the majority needed to advance clean energy rules at the Arizona Corporation Commission and to ensure adequate investments in a just and equitable transition from fossil fuels to clean energy. In this cycle we have an opportunity to tip the scale and elect a pro-clean energy majority on the ACC. We also have an opportunity to shift the balance of power in the legislature and elect pro-environment champions statewide. To do that, we need your help. Please consider supporting our endorsed candidates and helping to elect them to office.

This is our Primary Voter Guide so does not include all of our endorsements. We will send an additional guide in early October. That guide will include a comprehensive list of candidates we endorse as well as our recommendations on any ballot measures. So far, the Grand Canyon Chapter has endorsed both the Stop Dark Money measure to require disclosure of campaign funding and the Arizona Fair Elections Act to reinstate and expand voting opportunities.

U.S House of Representatives:



Congressional District 3 Ruben Gallego (i)

Representative Gallego is a strong advocate for environmental protection

and holds an important seat on the House Natural Resources Committee, where he has worked hard for the protection of public lands and wildlife. He is also an advocate for action on climate change and promoting clean energy resources and supported strong climate provisions in the budget reconciliation bill. Congressional District 4 Greg Stanton (i)

Congressional District 7 Raúl Grijalva (i)

Grijalva led efforts to protect public lands around Grand Canyon from uranium mining. He also sponsored the Save Oak Flat Act to reverse the land swap that will allow Resolution Copper to take ownership of Oak Flat. Sierra Club wholeheartedly endorses Rep. Raúl Grijalva.
