Army Corps of Engineers Cancels Annova LNG Permit Application

Brownsville, TX - Late last week, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers <u>removed</u> Annova LNG's permit application for consideration due to the company's inability to provide information on how it intends to receive fracked gas at its proposed facility.

Annova LNG is one of three liquefied natural gas export terminals proposed in the Rio Grande Valley. The other two - Texas LNG and Rio Grande LNG - are still awaiting federal permits.

The three proposed terminals have faced significant public opposition from local communities due to the threat they pose to public health, clean water, and wildlife.

In response, **Rebekah Hinojosa, Rio Grande Valley Organizer of the Sierra Club**, issued the following statement:

"Annova LNG is time and time again proving to be a bad deal. Two years ago, the Point Isabel School Board made the right choice to reject a tax abatement for Annova LNG. And now the company has been dumped by the Army Corps of Engineers. Annova LNG should quit now. There is tremendous opposition from the community."
