MBTA Fairmont Line Expansion

Beginning on May 18th for a pilot lasting for one year, the MTBA will expand service on the Fairmont Line. The pilot will add eight additional weekday trips, serving parts of Dorchester, Roxbury, Mattapan, and Hyde Park. Additionally, riders will be able to use their CharlieCards to pay for their fares during the pilot, which officials hope will make paying for transit easier. Read more from WBUR...

Transit Equity Day

On February 4th, Sierra Club along with allies participated in the bus ride and rally organized by Alternatives for Climate and Environment (ACE)/ Transit Riders Union (TRU) to honor Rosa Parks and highlight the need for safe, reliable, affordable, and environmentally sustainable transit. Transit advocates and Boston City Councilor, Michelle Wu rode MBTA bus #14 from Roslindale to Nubian Square during rush hour. We set aside a seat on the bus to honor Rosa Parks and spoke with riders about their transit experience. The day also included a rally in Nubian Square, calling for electrification of our public transit fleets, as well as free or affordable transit fares.

DPU Hearings for Eversource Rate Increases & Pipeline Expansion

On November 8, 2019, Eversource filed a rate review request with the Massachusetts Department of Public Utilities (DPU) to increase natural gas delivery rates. This rate increase proposal will affect all residents in Massachusetts who heat their homes with natural gas. Eversource is also proposing a new pipeline expansion project through Westborough & Southborough (the town of Westborough is currently opposing this pipeline) that will feed more dirty gas to Worcester and surrounding towns. The public has an opportunity to provide comments on the proposed increase and pipeline expansion. Public Meetings on 2050 Roadmap: Building Solutions to Address Climate Change in the Commonwealth

Please join the Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs for a series of public meetings on the Commonwealth's planning efforts to address climate change and reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Guided by the 2008 Global Warming Solutions Act, Massachusetts is currently studying how to achieve the ambitious climate goal of net-zero greenhouse gas emissions by 2050. These meetings will be an opportunity to learn about the state's research effort as well as to provide feedback on the state's 2050 emissions limit and the implementation plans to achieve it.
