EARTH DAY ACTION: Email Legislators To Extend The Legislative Session & Pass Critical Climate Policies

Massachusetts legislators have been rightly focused on responding to the COVID-19 pandemic by passing critical reforms, such as an eviction and rent moratorium and halting water and energy utility shutoffs. As Massachusetts hits its peak of coronavirus cases, it's important to remember that this will not be the last existential crisis most of us will face in our lifetimes.



The Commonwealth only has ten years to significantly reduce our climate emissions to meet the goals set out in the [2018 UN IPCC report](#). While the [Speaker has hinted at support for passing climate legislation sometime this year](#), plenty of uncertainty remains and the session is scheduled to end July 31, 2020. The legislature has a responsibility to extend the session this year to deal with urgent climate and environmental justice policies. Please ask your legislator to extend the session so we have time to pass these critical policies!

We all have varying capacity for advocacy at this time, so for those who have the energy and time to engage, this email includes a variety of opportunities to get involved with current issues and actions. In addition to highlighting virtual events, we're also sharing a handful of opportunities to participate in the COVID-19 response efforts.

There are drastic differences in how this pandemic impacts various populations. Check out this comprehensive [Massachusetts mutual aid spreadsheet](#) to support those in need during this time, or to ask for what you need. There are sections on health (mental and physical),

housing, childcare, location-specific aid resources, and more. In Massachusetts there are key policies we're asking for:

- **Extend the legislative session.** Sierra Club and our allies are [calling on legislators to extend the session](#) so that policymakers have an opportunity to review and pass critical climate and transportation bills.
- **Expand vote by mail laws.** Voters deserve the right to safely participate in elections. We're asking the state to allow rapid expansion of vote by mail ([more info here](#)) efforts for use by Sept 1 or earlier.
- **Emergency paid sick time for workers.** We support legislation to guarantee workers additional protected sick time to care for themselves or loved ones ([more info here](#)).

Celebrating the 30th Anniversary of the Cree and Inuit Voyage to Save Our Rivers

Earth Day 2020 is the 30th anniversary of one of the world's most historic, riveting and successful campaigns against megadam hydropower. This Indigenous-led campaign featured the voyage of the Odeyak hybrid canoe via dog sled, over land and down the Hudson River to NYC and resulted in the cancellation of NYC's contract with Hydro-Quebec's Great Whale Project.



This groundbreaking film was produced by [Standing Bear Network Indigenous](#) just for this Earth Day 2020 and the 30th anniversary of the Odeyak campaign. The film links contemporary U.S. energy policy to the cultural, environmental and economic harms caused by Canadian hydropower dams and their transmission corridors.
