A hearing on the Commonwealth's omnibus energy bill took place September 29th, and our voices were certainly heard. With over 350




people, nearly 10 pages of testifiers, and the momentum of a grassroots coalition, Mass Power Forward, this was truly a day for clean energy.

Testimony by Chapter Chair Cathy Buckley, Energy Chair Ed Woll, and National Clean Energy Organizer Drew Grande sent the message that we can no longer stifle the clean energy industry. We need an increased Renewable Portfolio Standard, to raise the cap on solar net metering, and we must wean off fossil fuels in any form.

Burning global oil, gas, and coal at current rates (producing 31 billion tons of carbon dioxide annually worldwide) will push us past the 3.6 degree Fahrenheit tipping point by 2030. To quote former NASA scientist James Hansen, "It is not difficult to imagine that conflicts



commonsense solution is to double our Renewable Portfolio Standard to 2%. With an additional 2% of energy being sourced from renewables each year (the current standard is 1%), we will be on track to **cut climate pollutants by 80% by 2050**, and help ensure our emissions ACTION: Tell House Speaker Robert DeLeo that you support a Renewable Portfolio Standard of 2% to put us on track to meet our emissions reduction goals.
