My point being that there is plenty of work and we certainly don't have it all covered. We don't have a Water Issues chair, for example. We have someone focused on electric vehicles, but not mass transit.

A volunteer (as we all are) may pick and choose as wide or as narrow an area as they are comfortable with. If you're a Sierra Club member with an interest and want to work within the Sierra Club organization at the local level, we welcome your participation.

We hope to have a member session by February that will allow people to come and learn about opportunities to get involved.
