


Piedmont Plateau - April 2021 E-News

Sierra Club, Piedmont Plateau Group is currently participating in the Haw River Assembly's Stream Monitoring Program. This is a program in which a person or group chooses a stream location somewhere in the Haw River Basin and, after an initial evaluation, monitors it 4 times (one each season) a year. HRA supplies equipment and training and we supply our time. The results are turned in to Haw River Assembly, evaluated, and any necessary action is taken.



There is a substantial threat to the streams in the basin as indicated in the above map.
