Nuclear Power and Just Sustainability: A Lesson from Japan

Nuclear power is popularly dubbed sustainable energy that is "green, safe, and cheap." This presentation examines this view, using lessons from Japan and considering just sustainability in the context of the increasingly urgent need to decarbonize the world.

Guest speaker, **Etsuko Kinefuchi, Ph.D.** is an associate professor of Communication Studies and affiliated faculty with Geography, Environment, and Sustainability at the University of North Carolina Greensboro. Her research examines the discourses at the intersections of culture, identity, and the environment from ecojustice perspectives. She is the author of *Competing Discourses on Japan's Nuclear Power: Pronuclear versus Antinuclear Activism.*

Etsuko currently serves on the Advisory Council of the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education (AASHE) and on the Board of Directors of the NC Climate Solutions. She is a lifetime member of the International Environmental Communication Association (IECA) and has represented the IECA as a delegate to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC).
