Drawdown Georgia is the first



state-centered climate solutions roadmap directly inspired by Project Drawdown. Leading researchers in Georgia came together to localize the <u>Project Drawdown framework</u>, resulting in a set of 20 high-impact climate solutions that can significantly cut greenhouse gas emissions in the state this decade. Since that research was released in October 2020, the Foundation has been working with partners across Georgia to grow these solutions in ways that advance equity, grow jobs, improve public health, and nourish the natural environment.

Difficulty level: Moderate

Five miles above its confluence with the Great Pee Dee, the Little Pee Dee divides and braids through a primordial cypress swamp into multiple interconnected channels, creating one of the most beautiful, unique, and secluded paddling experiences in the South Carolina coastal plain. This is a loop trip. Participants should be comfortable with some upstream paddling and maneuvering boats through tight passages, so this is not for beginners.
