Calumet Bike Park in Big Marsh

Jones, Chicago Park District General Superintendent Michael Kelly, Southeast Environmental Task Force President Tom Shepherd, and SRAM Vice President of Product and Marketing, Mike Mercuri participated in a media announcement at Southeast Chicago's Big Marsh on July 31, 2014. Part of the Millennium Reserve, and now owned by the Chicago Park District, the former industrial property has been designated as Big Marsh Park which is projected to become an urban wilderness redevelopment of national significance. The Calumet Bike Park at Big Marsh is to be the cornerstone of its eco-recreation plan. It will be modeled after the popular and successful Valmont Bike Park in Boulder, Colorado.

Legislative Update

We ended the Illinois General Assembly session with some wins and some losses this year according to reports from Jack Darin.

The win column included the defeat of an attempt to gut the power of IDNR to write regulations covering the fracking industry, which attempted to derail the public comment process in place. Also, attempts to fund development of the proposed Illiana Expressway did not succeed.

Bills that passed with Sierra Club support included SB 3049 that adds the Gray Wolf, American Black Bear and Cougar to the list of protected species under the Wildlife Code. Also, a bill passed to authorize up to \$30 million from the Renewable Energy Resources Fund for a one-time solar energy procurement to create jobs, jumpstart our solar industry and reduce air pollution. In addition, a clean water bill passed.

On the loss side was a failure to pass the no-cost fix to ratepayers for the Renewable Energy Standard (RPS), that would help ensure that renewable energy development, responsible for more than 20,000 jobs since 2007, continues.

Endorsements for General Election 2014

Endorsements for the fall election are not fully complete, but we can announce that Al Riley, D-38, an incumbent state representative who has been a strong supporter of environmental issues, has been endorsed. Also, Robin Kelly, U.S. Representative for the Illinois 2nd District, has been endorsed by the Sierra Club.
