What is Ready for 100?

Ready for 100 is a movement of your neighbors working to create a vision of a healthier community powered by 100% clean and renewable energy. Together we are calling on cities, towns, institutions and industry to commit to a long-term, ambitious 100% clean, renewable energy goal, and then back it up with measurable plans and near-term actions.

PA cities and towns are hubs for innovation and have been leading the way on climate, through the Mayor's Climate Compact and local sustainability plans. We know that 100% clean, renewable energy is the new standard for local climate protection.

We are asking township supervisors, mayors, CEOs, pastors, principals, civic and community leaders, parents and students to commit to solutions that help us achieve 100% clean, renewable energy across Pennsylvania by the year 2050 or sooner.

A 100% goal is achieved when the amount of energy generated from renewable energy sources in the city (or brought into it) equals (or exceeds) 100% of the annual energy consumed within that city. Many cities start by shifting their electricity to 100% renewable.

The benefits of clean, renewable energy are clear:

Saves money

Stanford scientists say the transition to 100% clean and renewable energy will save the average family over \$350 dollars per year in energy costs by 2030 and another \$1,500 per year in health care costs.

Creates good-paying jobs

The solar industry already employs over 200,000 people, nearly twice as many people as the coal mining industry. And according to the recent Solar Jobs Census, solar jobs grew 12 times faster than the overall economy in 2015, making solar one of the fastest-growing industries in America, and the fastest-growing industry in the world! Wind power generation has more than doubled in the past four years. Wind power employs over 80,000 people in the United States, and over 70% of wind turbine equipment is made in the U.S.

Is affordable

The prices have declined for both wind and solar over the past six years. Which means that supporting clean, renewable energy is not just about leadership, it's also about supporting our local economies, jobs, and the health of our communities.

Protects our health and our climate

NO air pollution
NO oil spills
NO gas leaks
NO water contamination
And is carbon neutral

Why do we need local renewable energy now?

Because we want everyone to have access to affordable, clean, renewable energy.

AND because we now have a safer alternative - cleaner, cheaper, healthier energy.

It's time for our local communities to step up to the plate. We all deserve clean air, good jobs, and strong leadership.
