September 13 Program: Gary Gibbons presents "World Within Itself"

Recently returning from a "bucket list" trip to the Galapagos, Gary will recount



his exploration of the unique ecology of these remote and isolated islands. From their early history as the inspiration of Darwin's "Origin of the Species" to their current status as a World Heritage Site the Galapagos have endured as a natural wonder. In the words

of Charles Darwin, "The archipelago is a little world within itself". You will want to be there as Gary shares his experience and observations of this "little world" through his skills as a talented photographer.

October 11 Program: Nationally recognized birder Rocky Milburn presents "Specialty Birds of Florida"

Rocky will be highlighting several of the rare and endangered species that are primarily found in the Sunshine



State such as the Scrub Jay, the Burrowing Owl, Roseate Spoonbill, American Oyster Catcher, Reddish Egret and more. If you've ever been on an outing or nature hike with Rocky, you know what a treat this will be. Rocky has a long history surveying birds for the USGS and ELAPP. And he has been the winner of the June Challenge 2 of the last 4 years, spotting more birds than anyone in the entire state. He spent 10 years working as Audubon national staff on the Roseate




Spoonbill Alafia Banks project. Experience birders and novices alike are sure to learn more about Florida's birds from this expert presentation. Don't miss it!

Conservation Committee Report

The Conservation Committee is currently working on the following pressing items:

Say NO to sewage-effluent dumping on the Little Manatee River!

Chris's Plumbing Service, which runs a huge commercial septic operation, is asking Hillsborough County to let them dump effluent from human excrement, commercial sludge, and restaurant grease on the banks of the Little Manatee River's wetlands. They have applied for a special use permit to spread **100,000 gallons a day** (!!!) of sewage effluent across 36 acres of a site that sits on the Little Manatee River system. A large part of the site is wetlands that flow right into the river.

Toxic waste that ends up in the river can cause devastating fish kills and human health dangers.

Push for Transit for Hillsborough County

Hillsborough County has the worst funded transit in the country, equivalent to Sheboygan, Wisconsin. We need to encourage Hillsborough County to increase funding for HART and plan for additional transit services.

<u>ACTION:</u> Attend Thursday, September 7 & 14 BOCC Budget Meetings and request more funding for transit, including HART service, CSX Train conversion and Ferry Service.

Help prevent urban sprawl

The *Future of Hillsborough Comprehensive Plan for Unincorporated Hillsborough County* provides land use criteria for rural and urban areas. Developers often request changing designations from rural to residential, increasing sprawl. At the September meeting, Commissioner Kemp will describe the plan in more detail.

<u>ACTION:</u> Join the new subcommittee being formed to understand the plan and defend the rural areas from development encroachment.
