

Tampa Bay Recycling Program Selected for NFL Website



In honor of the National Football League's 100th season, the NFL has created the "Huddle for 100" program. This program invites fans to partner with them, the players and their teams to choose a

cause, volunteer 100 minutes of their time and help shape their community in a positive manner. The NFL's goal is to record 100 million volunteer minutes in one season across the United States. It is a major NFL undertaking and is being promoted through radio and television advertising along with social media.

Now in the 29th consecutive season, the Tampa Bay Group's Stadium Recycling Initiative at Raymond James Stadium qualified. So, lead volunteer, David Varrieur, submitted the application on behalf of the Tampa Bay Group. The application basically stated: "This is the Tampa Bay Sierra Club's Stadium Recycling Initiative. It's the first NFL recycling program started in 1990. We have 20 volunteers @ 2 hours per event for all events. 120 minutes per person per event. 2,400 minutes per person annually. 48,000 minutes annually as a group. We recycled with Jack Groh (Director of the NFL Environmental Program) for Superbowl XLIII."

Thousands of entries were submitted from all over the United States. But only one could be featured on the prestigious "20 million milestone reached!" section of the NFL Huddle for 100 website. That one is the Tampa Bay Group. It goes to say that everyone involved was thrilled by this amazing accomplishment! The Stadium Recycling Initiative works like this: Prior to the start of each stadium event. Sierra Club volunteers act as event day educational ambassadors. They encourage spectators to recycle using the recycling stations located both in and out of the stadium. A typical event will include 20 volunteers dressed in Sierra Club shirts. They stand at recycling stations at entry gates around the stadium, thanking guests for supporting the Sierra Club recycling program. This season, volunteers expanded into the parking lots and adjacent streets picking up plastic, aluminum and glass containers to bring back and deposit into the stadium recycling bins. Their efforts have resulted in collecting thousands of tons of recycled materials annually that may have ended up in incinerators.

After their shift, the volunteers are compensated by free entry into the event and they sit in the employee seating areas around the stadium. The Sierra Club Tampa Bay Group is compensated financially per event. This program is continuously the single largest annual fundraiser for them.

The Stadium Recycling Initiative continues to be an incredible recycling success story for the Tampa Bay community and fundraiser for the Tampa Bay Group. This season has events that include the Gasparilla Bowl, the Outback Bowl, the first XFL game and WrestleMania. The volunteers are also hopeful that the group will be invited to work the Super-Bowl in 2021. Contact David Varrieur at AppraiserAndRealtor@gmail.com to volunteer

Conservation Committee Report: The Conservation Committee and Transportation and Water Sub-Committees meet on Mondays, **November 11 and December 9** at 6:30 PM at <u>St. Paul Lutheran Church, 5103</u> <u>North Central Ave</u>, Tampa. We meet in the <u>Snyder Building</u>, directly behind the church.

There are many things going on, and the more volunteers we have, the more we can do! Come to the meeting to learn more and see where you might want to get involved.

WATER: TAP has been tabled for at least one year and will not be funded in the water rate increase. Thank you all who wrote to City Council and Mayor Castor – your concerns were heard. Florida Potable Reuse Commission is developing standards for water reuse such as proposed by the Tampa Augmentation Project (TAP)– Benjamin Ochshorn, Water sub-committee chair.

LAND: Upper Tampa Bay Trail – we are reviewing rezoning application 19-1444 with developer plans to cross the trail to access proposed development, resulting in 1000 cars per day crossing popular Hillsborough trail. ZHM meeting will be December 16.

CLEAN AIR: Ready for 100 Launch: We will work with Tampa Mayor Jane Castor, City Council and County Commissioners to sign up Tampa for 100% Renewable energy. If you would like to join this effort, contact Phil Compton: **phil.compton@sierraclub.org** or 813-841-3601.

STATE: M-CORES, Contact FDOT at **fdot.listens@dot.state.fl.us** and let them know that the you oppose the M-CORES project: three new major toll roads that will destroy large swaths of Florida's last remaining rural lands, pollute waterways, and threaten endangered wildlife including the iconic Florida panther.

TREES: Florida HB 1159 allows trees to be removed if they present a danger. This was used to take down 27 trees in a lot in Tampa despite protests from tree advocates that the trees presented no danger. A hearing will be held October 30, 9AM in Tampa City Council chambers.

Biographies of the Candidates for the Executive Committee

Kent Bailey: Kent Bailey has served as Chair of the Tampa Bay Sierra Club Group since May of 2014. As an environmental volunteer, Kent's priorities have included preservation of natural lands, fighting sprawl and promoting transit; but most importantly sharing climate change awareness and reducing carbon pollution. Kent is currently engaged educating the public about TECO's plans to expand fossil fuel combustion. **Barbara Heineken:** Barbara became the City of Tampa's first recycling coordinator. She is responsible for starting many of the programs that we are familiar with today, including the stadium recycling initiative, and recycling at the Gasparilla parades. She has been a member of Sierra Club over 30 years, leads outings

and is involved with ICO. Barbara is running for the executive committee because she feels we need to work hard to protect our precious environment and Sierra Club is a very important voice in that effort. Bob Howell: I've worked with multiple Fish and Wildlife agencies to advocate the protection and restoration of streams and restoring fish habitats. I have worked with the US Forest Service to restore trails in the National Forests. I continue to work to protect wetlands, streams, and coastlines in Hillsborough, Pasco, and Hernando. Petitions, protests, rallies, dispelling misinformation about Electric Vehicles, and making presentations to Pasco County BOCC so often that they would say, "Hi Bob." My most significant effect has been the rejuvenation of Sierra's presence in Hernando and Citrus County. I seek to continue

Member of the National Volunteer Leadership Action Committee that reports to the national board, and the National Outings Cohort Team. Also currently volunteer steward for Hillsborough County ELAPP program for the Wolf Branch Creek site. Nancy Stevens: As chair of the Tampa Bay Group Conservation Committee, I lead a team deeply involved in taking action on critical issues facing the region today – from water use, Tree preservation, to Ready for 100, from transit to intelligent land use. The goal is to not only protect what we have, but work with local governments to put in place necessary regulations to protect it for the future. I am applying my experience as an engineer and project manager to the environmentally challenges we face so that we cannot only stop degradation of our natural environment, but also improve our quality of life.

Don't 'wish-cycle' – When in doubt, throw it out! We all want to protect and conserve resources by recycling. But attempting to recycle items that can't be recovered in your local curbside recycling program

"wish-cycling" actually causes more harm than good. If you're not sure if an item is recyclable or not, always discard it in your gray trash cart. When in doubt, throw it out!
