

Everett Bans Plastic Bags

The Everett City Council has voted in favor of implementing a Reusable Bag Ordnance, making Everett the 25th city in the state to pass legislation regarding single use plastic bags. The ordinance goes into effect September, 2019.

Edmonds Marsh Restoration Project

The Edmonds City Council approved \$1M for Marsh restoration in their 2019 budget. This money will be added to the existing \$300K in the City's Marsh fund for use as matching funds in grant applications to establish open tidal channels between the Marsh and Puget Sound (also called the "daylighting" project).

North Seattle Lateral Upgrade Pipeline

This pipeline project is on hold pending further environmental impact studies. Snohomish County is now requiring a full emissions analysis, from extraction to installation and usage. Permitting decisions for expansion of the North Seattle Lateral Pipeline will be based on the information provided to the County.
