The <u>Communities of Color Coalition</u> (C3) is a non-partisan group of citizens who meet on behalf of the people of Snohomish County to discuss, problem-solve, and advocate for social justice, cultural and religious respect and human rights, especially for people of color and other under-represented groups.

Their major areas of concern include but are not limited to the elimination of personal and institutional racism; equal access to and opportunities in education; equal access to and opportunities in economic development and employment; and fair and equal treatment under the law and in our society.

Events

Juneteenth celebrated on June 19

This holiday commemorates the abolition of slavery in Texas on June 19,1865. Texas was the last state to have the Emancipation Proclamation read and enforced. Other names for the day include Freedom Day, Jubilee Day, Cel-Liberation Day and the Black Fourth of July.

The day is especially significant this year as our nation looks ahead to all that still needs to happen for people of color in this country to be truly and fully free and equal.

Juneteenth is not a Federal holiday, but 43 states and the District of Columbia recognize it as either a state holiday or a ceremonial holiday. Efforts to have the day nationally recognized as Juneteenth Independence Day have been rejected in the US Senate.
