Sierra Club Statement on GTac Land Closure Tax Break Approval

Madison: The Sierra Club released the following statement on the passage of SB 278, extreme special interest legislation that will prohibit public access to public lands in Ashland and Iron Counties owned by speculators who have leased their lands to Gogebic Taconite (GTac).

"As one of their last acts of 2013, Assembly Republicans gave Gogebic Taconite yet another special favor that tramples the rights of the public," said Shahla Werner, PhD, John Muir Chapter Director. "SB 278 gives the owners of the land GTac leases a nearly \$1 million tax break to close public lands while creating a logistical and financial nightmare for local law enforcement who will bear the burden of this unnecessary legislation. The legislation grants the mining landowners special rights that none of the more than 30,000 law-abiding landowners in the Managed Forest Law program can take advantage of."

The Sierra Club urges Governor Walker to veto SB 278 as unnecessary and poor public policy that threatens to set important legal and policy precedents regarding regulation of lands maintained in the state Managed Forest Law system.

Gogebic Taconite does not own property in Wisconsin. It has leased land and mineral rights from three property owners and Iron County (surface rights only):
