Tell Boston to require new large buildings to be net-zero carbon emissions and limit climate pollution!

Right now, Boston has an opportunity to dramatically reduce building pollution - the largest contributor to the city's carbon emissions. Boston has released a draft policy that will require new large buildings (over 20,000 square feet) in the city to achieve zero net carbon emissions. This is a key step in ensuring the city will meet its stated goal of being carbon-free by 2050—a step that the city committed to taking in its 2019 climate action plan update.

Five MA School Districts Receive EPA Grants for School Bus Electrification



The EPA has announced 2022 grant recipients for their Clean School Bus program. Five school districts in MA (Fall River, Lawrence, Pioneer Valley, New Bedford, Upper Cape Cod) have received grants totaling \$29.5 million to procure electric school buses. Thanks to your advocacy, there has been a lot of interest in the program. It was oversubscribed with over 40 MA school districts applying for funding.

Additional rounds of funding are expected soon, so continue to advocate to your school district. The EPA will be announcing a grant and rebate program in Q1 and Q2 of 2023 that school districts can apply for. Here's a handy toolkit that you can use in your advocacy.

If your school district is not ready to procure electric buses just yet but is looking for an actionable plan to electrify their fleet, MassCEC is offering no-cost " <u>School Bus Advisory Services</u>" and is accepting applications. Ask your school district to <u>fill out this interest form</u> to get more information.

The November 8 General Election is fast approaching. Cast a vote for our health, our communities, and our planet.

We have gathered some <u>helpful information</u> related to voting this November:

- Voter Registration Deadline: October 29, 2022
- Vote by Mail Application Deadline: November 1, 2022
- Early Voting: October 22 November 4
- Election Day Polling Hours: 7 a.m. 8 p.m.

On Ballot: Representative in Congress, Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, State Auditor, Governor's Council, State Senator, State Representative, District Attorney, Sheriff, County Commissioner (only in certain counties), statewide ballot guestions.*

*Ballots in some counties and communities may have additional local offices and questions.
