Indiana 2023 Legislative Session: Greed, Hate, Harm

Indiana's 123rd legislative session can be summed up in three words: Greed, Hate and Harm.

The leadership of both the Indiana House and the Indiana Senate put the greed of special interests ahead of the needs of everyday people in their districts. They passed bills described by civil liberties organizations as "The Slate of Hate." And in the midst of the climate crisis and economic uncertainty, they backed fossil fuels and handed over more of our money to monopoly utilities. Their actions this session will directly harm Hoosiers' lives and homes, as well as our air, land and water. Governor Holcomb signed those bills into law, and we've included him in this year's Scorecard as well.

Legislators passed two bills into Indiana law, House Bill (HB) 1417 and Senate Bill (SB) 9, on behalf of Indiana's largest monopoly utility, Duke Energy Indiana, overturning court orders^{*} that hurt the monopoly utility's bottom line and piling costs on to Hoosiers already struggling to pay their electric bills.

Also benefiting Indiana's monopoly utilities was the passage of HB 1623, the final version of which included a provision that severely restricts the Indiana Department of Environmental Management from safely regulating the disposal of coal ash, a main byproduct of burning coal. Indiana has more coal ash pits than any other state. This bill also restricts the State Chemist's ability to safely regulate pesticides at the behest of a lawn care company.

Rolls Royce will benefit from SB 176, which increases the size of small modular nuclear reactors that Duke and other monopoly utilities can charge customers to develop from 350 MW to 470 MW. SMRs are a costly technology that won't be available for years to come, if ever - and too late for action on climate change.

Sierra Club is a member-based, grassroots organization. When we and our friends, family, neighbors and coworkers aren't safe, we won't stay silent. This year, we have added a Democracy and Justice grade to our Scorecard. Defending democracy and human rights is inextricably linked to our ability to protect our communities, the environment and the climate. When legislators threaten Hoosiers' well-being and block access to information, we recall decades of deception and lies about pollution and climate change and ongoing misinformation that threatens our health and our lives.

We want to cast light on legislators who support bigoted and harmful legislation such as SB 480, which prohibits transgender youth under 18 from receiving gender-affirming care and life-saving medical interventions, and HB 1608, which prohibits age-appropriate classroom instruction on LGBTQ+ families and requires teachers to "out" transgender students to a parent or guardian.

We also included your legislators' votes on a book-banning bill, HB 1447, and SB 1, for which the legislature held a 2022 Special Session further restricting abortion rights in Indiana.

Democracy works best when citizens can easily access information about how their legislators vote on important issues, and the Indiana legislature is far from transparent. We hope this scorecard will empower you to hold your legislators accountable.

About the Indiana General Assembly

The Indiana General Assembly is the legislative body and one of three co-equal branches of Indiana State Government. The primary role of the Indiana General Assembly is to enact laws governing the state of Indiana. There are two chambers in the General Assembly (House of Representatives and Senate). The House of Representatives has 100 members elected to two year terms.

The Senate has 50 members elected to four year terms. Every citizen in Indiana has one member representing you in the State House of Representatives and one member representing you in the State Senate. In order for a proposed piece of legislation to become law it must pass both the House and Senate at the Indiana General Assembly during a legislative session. Once it passes both houses, it is sent to the Governor who may sign it, veto it, or do nothing (in which case, the bill becomes law by default. If he vetoes legislation, then the Indiana General Assembly may override that veto.

Extra Credit on Legislation Not Receiving a Vote

Bills introduced during the legislative session are not guaranteed a vote at the Indiana General Assembly. However, many legislators introduce or co-author bills to tackle environmental issues like climate change, coal ash cleanup, and renewable energy.

That's why, while many bills did not get a vote, we did add extra credit points to the overall score for legislators who introduced or co-authored environmental legislation we supported to reflect their leadership on environmental policy in Indiana. Extra Credit scores are reflected in the legislators "Overall Session Grade".

Scoring Categories

Sustainable Energy: Legislation that impacts energy sources and benefits utility interests. In 2023, laws were passed that give "blank checks" to utilities and harm consumers, incentivize the continuation of fossil fuel usage, make a clean energy transition more burdensome, and more.

Conservation: Legislation that impacts Hoosiers' air, land, and water. Included here are bills that seek to impact protections of water quality, addressing exposure to toxins, conservation funding, and more.

Democracy and Justice: Legislation that directly harms Hoosiers by targeting their health, education, and democracy. Included in 2023 are bills that ban books in our schools, prevent transgender youth from obtaining life-affirming care, ban those with the ability to get pregnant from reproductive health care, and more.

Sustainable Energy Policy -Bill Summaries

SB 176 Small modular nuclear reactors

Sierra Club Position: Oppose

On behalf of Rolls Royce, which has a headquarters in Indianapolis and is developing a 470 MW small modular nuclear reactor, increases the megawatt capacity limit for small modular nuclear reactor utility incentives from 350 megawatts to 470 megawatts.

HB 1173 Utility scale battery energy storage systems

Sierra Club Position: Oppose

Singles out and creates excessive regulatory hurdles for construction of utility scale energy storage systems. Requires approval of new energy storage systems through the Department of Homeland Security and sets forth information required in applications.

HB 1421 CWIP for gas plants

Sierra Club Position: Oppose

Classifies gas and biogas as "clean energy" which would make dirty energy projects eligible for clean energy incentives. With many utilities proposing large-scale gas projects, customers could be saddled with significant rate increases.

HB 1420 Anti-competitive transmission

Sierra Club Position: Oppose

Gives Indiana utility companies the "right of first refusal" to build, own, and operate new transmission lines in their service area — preventing new projects from being competitively bid on by other companies – and raises customer bills.

HB 1417 Blank check (Duke/coal ash)

Sierra Club Position: Oppose

Gives a "blank check" to monopoly utilities, allowing them to spend customer money now and get approval for projects later.

SB 9 Another blank check (Duke/coal ash) and IURC notice for retirements

Sierra Club Position: Oppose

Again, allows utilities to pass along certain costs to customers for federally mandated projects without having to get pre-approval for those projects from state regulators. Requires utilities to notify the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission in advance if they decide to retire or sell a generating facility earlier than announced in their 20-year energy plan.

Conservation Policy Bill Summaries

HB 1008 Anti-ESG

Sierra Club Position: Oppose

Written to prevent the Indiana Public Retirement System (INPRS) from making investments based on environmental, social and governance considerations.

HB 1138 Lead testing

Sierra Club Position: Support

Requires testing of drinking water in preschool and child care facilities.

HB 1219 PFAS monitoring

Sierra Club Position: Support

Requires tracking exposure to PFAS chemicals among firefighters.

HB 1304 LARE funding

Sierra Club Position: Support

Increases funds for DNR's Lake and River Enhancement grants through increased renewal fees.

HB 1623 Admin rulemaking

Sierra Club Position: Oppose

Increases the burden of rulemaking for state agencies, prevents IDEM from adopting coal ash disposal rules more stringent than the EPA coal ash rule, and puts restrictions on state agencies' ability to limit pesticides and herbicides.

Democracy & Justice Policy Bill Summaries

SB 480 Gender transition procedures for minors

Sierra Club Position: Oppose

Anti-Trans legislation that prohibits transgender youth under 18 from receiving gender affirming care and life saving medical interventions widely available to cis gender youth. SB 480 provides civil enforcement for physicians and practitioners who provide gender affirming care to transgender youth.

SB 1 (2022 SPECIAL SESSION) Abortion

Sierra Club Position: Oppose

During a special session in June 2022, following the Supreme Court's Dobbs decision, the Indiana Legislature passed a zero day ban on abortion services and revoked licenses for abortion access clinics. SB 1 further establishes limited exceptions for health, in vitro fertilization and survivors of sexual assault.

HB 1608 <u>"Don't Say Gay"</u>

Sierra Club Position: Oppose

The "Don't Say Gay" bill prohibits age appropriate classroom instruction on LGBTQ families and requires teachers to out transgender students to a parent or guardian disregarding concerns for student safety, professional ethics and privacy protections.

HB 1447 Book Ban Education matters

Sierra Club Position: Oppose

Expands censorship in school libraries and provides criminal penalties for teachers and librarians if a parent disagrees with materials made available to students.
