WHEREAS, protecting public health and the environment is a vital public service; and

WHEREAS, air pollution remains one of our greatest public health challenges, especially in the most densely populated state in the nation; and

WHEREAS, vehicle emissions are the largest source of air pollutants in New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, vehicle emissions are a large contributor to ground-level ozone, commonly known as smog, as well as the largest source of air toxics, and the largest contributor to climate change and sea level rise in New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, these emissions cause serious health effects including asthma, cancer, chronic lung disease, heart disease, diabetes and premature death; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey has been a leader in reducing emissions from vehicles and other sources of air pollution; and

WHEREAS, a critical strategy to achieve significant reductions in ozone, air toxics and greenhouse gases is to switch from fossil-fueled vehicles to electric vehicles; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey has allocated \$27.2 million in Volkswagen settlement funds for electric heavy-duty garbage trucks, transit and school, buses and port-related equipment in environmental justice communities, as well as charging infrastructure statewide; and

WHEREAS, a first-of-its-kind, statewide multi-agency partnership to accelerate adoption of electric vehicles, the New Jersey Partnership to Plug-In, has been established;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Philip D. Murphy, Governor of the State of New Jersey, do hereby proclaim:
