Plants, — — — — — — — — — — — — — — — — — — —	Trees, Shrubs A type of leaf Pinecone A tree or shrub that still has leaves A tree or shrub that still has fruit/berries A hollow tree trunk Fungus or mushrooms A canker/deformity on a tree trunk A cattail A tree, shrub or other plant eaten by an insect or bird A tree with smooth, papery bark A tree with rough bark A tree forming an arch over a trail A vine climbing up a tree Tall grass An evergreen tree (cedar, pine etc.) Seeds or seed pods A red stem/bark plant or shrub Dead flowers
