

2021 Services to be Performed by Chapter Lobbyist

1. Serve as the designated government and legislative representative of the Nebraska Chapter of the Sierra Club ("Chapter"). Duties include monitoring legislation under consideration, advising the Chapter which legislation is of interest to the Chapter, and advocating the Chapter's interests and positions, as directed by the Chapter Executive Committee ("ExCom"), directly and through the Legislative Chair, before the Executive and Legislative branches of the Nebraska State Government for the duration of the 2021 legislative session (including any delays thereof).
2. Maintain communication with Chapter ExCom and attend, report to, and consult with the Chapter ExCom on legislative and governmental issues at each ExCom meeting, unless there shall be reasonable cause for absence from any such meeting. (Regular scheduled Saturday morning meetings are held in January, March, June, September, and December from 9:30am - 12:00pm.) Assist in the formation of the Chapter's strategy regarding legislative and governmental issues.
3. Furnish informational reports for reproduction on the Chapter website and other Chapter printed and electronic publications, in addition to weekly reports to the Chapter Legislative Committee. Utilize platforms available through National Sierra Club for efficiency.
4. Maintain registration as a lobbyist for the Chapter with the Clerk of the Nebraska Legislature and file all such reports and information required by such registration. File any such reports required by the Nebraska Accountability and Disclosure Commission.
5. Prepare action alerts on the status of legislation and actions needed for distribution to the membership when appropriate to advocate the Chapter's position on an issue at hand. Work with the individual designated by the Chapter to expedite the action alerts to membership.
6. Represent no other organization or individual whose overall policies and/or position on individual matters conflict with that of the Chapter.

7. Contractor may, at the Contractor's own expense, employ such assistants as Contractor deems necessary to perform the services required of Contractor by this agreement. Contractor may not control, direct, or supervise Contractor's assistants or employees in the performance of those services. Contractor assumes full and sole responsibility for the payment of all compensation and expenses of these assistants for all state and federal income tax, unemployment insurance, workers' compensation insurance, Social Security, disability insurance and other applicable withholdings.
