RE: Nebraska 2019 Legislative Session, Week Ending April 18, 2019

WEEK IN REVIEW

Today, Thursday, April 18th is the 62nd day of the 90 day 2019 legislative session. This week the legislature stated full day floor debate. At noon today the legislature adjourned, for a four day Easter weekend, until Tuesday, April 23rd for the 63rd day.

LB155 ANTI by Senator Brewer to "Change eminent domain provisions that apply to privately developed renewable energy generation facilities" previously had stalled after three hours of debate. This week LB155 was taken up again, and extensive debate was renewed, but a compromise was crafted between Senators Pansing-Brooks and DeBoer and Senator Brewer. The wind energy industry supported the compromise. AM1380 was adopted on a vote of 37 yes and 1 no (Sen. Lowe; Hunt not voting); whereupon LB155 having been replaced by AM1380 was advanced to Select File on a vote of 40 yes (including Lowe) and 1 no (Sen. Hunt). AM1380 is attached.

Tuesday's agenda lists far more bills than can be accomplished, so Tuesday's agenda will be must of next week's agenda. On Tuesday's agenda in 17th place on Select File is our Ornate Box Turtle specialty licenses plate bill (originally LB691 PRO by Senator Cavanaugh but now merged into LB356 by Speaker Scheer. Also on Select File, in 16th place, is Senator Koleterman's LB23 PRO to amend the Property Assessed Clean Energy Act (that had been amended to match Sierra Club's priorities).

Two bills not exactly to Sierra Club's liking are on the Tuesday agenda in 10th place on Select File and in 25th place on General File. LB585 MONITOR by Senator Friesen to "Create the Renewable Fuel Infrastructure Program and provide for grants" is in 10th place. Senator Friesen's AM1419 does not make LB585 much more attractive to the Sierra Club. In 25th is LB700 PRO by Senator Bostelman to "provide for decommissioning and reclamation of a wind energy conservation system". AM1098 is a white copy amendment proposed by the Natural Resources Committee for LB700. AM1098 is more attractive to the Sierra Club (e.g., reclaim to condition before use; preserve local control) than the original LB700.

Also note that Senator Chamber's priority bill, LB44 to repeal the death penalty, appears on next week's General File agenda in 40th place. Traditionally, this topic is the subject of extensive debate.

(c) The joint transmission development agreement shall address 1 2 construction, ownership, operation, and maintenance of such additions or 3 upgrades to the transmission facilities as required for the privately developed renewable energy generation facility. The joint transmission 4 5 development agreement shall be negotiated and executed contemporaneously 6 with the generator interconnection agreement or other directives of the 7 applicable regional transmission organization with jurisdiction over the 8 addition or upgrade of transmission, upon terms consistent with prudent 9 electric utility practices for the interconnection of renewable generation facilities, the electric supplier's reasonable transmission 10 11 interconnection requirements, and applicable transmission design and 12 construction standards. The electric supplier shall have the right to purchase and own transmission facilities as set forth in the joint 13 14 transmission development agreement. The private electric supplier of the 15 privately developed renewable energy generation facility shall have the right to construct any necessary facilities or improvements set forth in 16 17 the joint transmission development agreement pursuant to the standards set forth in the agreement at the private electric supplier's cost. 18

19 (3) (2) Within ten days after receipt of a written notice complying
20 with subsection (2) (1) of this section, the executive director of the
21 board shall issue a written acknowledgment that the privately developed
22 renewable energy generation facility is exempt from sections 70-1012 to
23 70-1014.01.
