Recent Event Successes Water Quality in Iowa — Library Event **Draws Capacity Crowd**

About 100 people packed the Fairfield Library March 22 to hear a panel of local farmers speak about water quality in Iowa. Francis Thicke, PhD, soil scientist and owner of Radiance Dairy Farm gave a power PointPoint presentation on the challenges of nutrient runoff in March and talked about how to solve the issue. After Francis spoke 3 farmers from the Farm Bureau talked about their varying degrees of experience with cover crops. The event was well received with a front page article in the Fairfield
